Communion Offering to "Bless the Kids"

Our September 4, 2022 Communion offering will go to our "Bless the Kids" program, which has been on-going now for several years, yet the need seems to become greater each year. There are many children in the Flour Bluff School District who have little or no access to



meals over weekends and school holidays, nor do they have enough clothes or school supplies for success at school. Dawna Gadberry, the retired teacher from Flour Bluff Elementary who has worked tirelessly in coordinating the program and in doing the physical labor that it takes, makes sure that the food, clothes and supplies get to the children who need them most. Currently, she buys healthy, non-perishable foods and water in bulk with the donated funds, and on Thursdays she and helpers fill backpacks with 3 meals per day for the weekend or school break days, and then distributes them on Fridays before the kids go home. Right now, she is working with 30 kids in the Early Childhood Development area, but she says there are at least 200 children of all ages in the District who are on the "need help" list.

In addition to meal items, many of the kids are in need of clothes in the proper sizes. In speaking with Dawna re-

cently, she mentioned that blue jeans, any size from 4 up to adult, gently used (with no holes) would be greatly



appreciated, as well as shirts (solid color T-shirts with no logos, polos, button downs, etc.), shorts, belts, socks, shoes, and underwear (must be new). Personal hygiene items are desperately needed as well, and since many kids started school without the proper school supplies, any of those items would be put to use gladly. Dawna is



concerned that the numbers of needy kids in her area seem to be increasing, partly due to the downward economic effects on the parents during these difficult times,

and she wants to thank our Church and each and every one of us who donates to the program, because, she says, many of these kids would go hungry were it not for us and a few other donors who go "above and beyond" to support the most needy in our area. Our charitable contributions demonstrate our commitment to following the teachings of our Lord by helping those in His flock who would be "lost" otherwise.



Botanical Gardens Seeks Bottles for Fall Art Project

South Texas Botanical Gardens & Nature Center needs empty green plastic bottles with lids for a Holly Days art project, to be created by internationally-known local environmental artist, Shelia Rogers. Rogers will use 3,500 bottles to create an 18-foot, lit-from-within Christmas tree for the wintervacant Plumeria Garden. Holly Days will offer family-friendly activities at the Gardens four weekends beginning November 25 and 26.

Rogers' life's work communicates complexities and attractions she finds in her environment, especially waterfronts and beaches. One of her works, a clear plastic bottle "Chandelier," hung at Corpus Christi International Airport before moving to Texas A&M-Corpus Christi in 2020. Her "Oceans of Plastic" exhibited at the Texas State Aquarium, several art museums, and at the George H.W. Bush Presidential Library. "The Thrill of the Deep" exhibited in seven German cities, Paris, Vienna, and Zurich.

"The heart of my work is environmental advocacy, seductively exposing the real and devastating effects of plastic pollution on the world's oceans," Rogers said. "The intent of my work is to raise awareness of this pressing consumer and environmental issue, while motivating viewers toward a plastic-use reduction revolution."
